Section 2. Labor Category Descriptions

1. Program Manager

Functional Responsibility: Program Managers oversee and manage significant environmental consulting and remediation efforts that span several projects or are comprised of large tasks with several staff assigned. The Program Manager is responsible for the quality assurance/quality control on deliverable documents and ensures that the project is delivered within the budget and schedule described in the contract. The Program Manager supervises staff performing on tasks, interfaces with customers to solve problems and provide advice, and provides project management guidance.

Education /Experience: This level represents a professional with more than 10 years of experience, at least two of which is in Program Management of Environmental programs, and has a Master's Degree and/or Bachelor's Degree in environmental science/engineering or a related discipline.

2. Professional Level 4

Functional Responsibility: Level 4 managers or technical experts direct environmental projects, the development of plans, implementation of investigation/studies, and reports. At this Level 4, managers/technical experts are responsible for project and budget management, technology development, establishing performance and technical standards/training.

Education /Experience: This level represents a professional with more than 10 years of experience, a Master's Degree and/or Bachelor's Degree in environmental science/engineering or a related discipline.

3. Professional Level 3

Functional Responsibility: This level of environmental professional prepares and oversees environmental plans, consults on regulatory and compliance decisions and supports data analyses. Professionals at this level also provide technical and data management, project management, develop statements of work, and track progress against the schedule and budget of the task order.

Education /Experience: Level 3 represents a professional with at least nine years of experience and a MS and/or BS in environmental science/engineering or a related discipline, OR 10 +years of experience that is relevant and applicable as determined by the hiring manager.

4. Professional Level 2

Functional Responsibility: This level of professional assists the project manager with environmental documentation, investigation and remediation projects, and

supports customers in interpreting environmental regulations and selecting technologies.

Education /Experience: Level 2 represents a professional with 4 – 9 years of experience, a MS and/or BS in environmental science/engineering or a related discipline.

5. Professional Level 1

Functional Responsibility: This level of professional serves as a staff engineer or scientist and works under the supervision of a Professional Level 2 or 3 to deliver environmental projects and assists customers in environmental management, consulting and remediation choices.

Education /Experience: A Professional Level 1 represents entry level professional with 0 to 3 years of experience, a MS and/or BS in environmental science/engineering or a related discipline.

6. Draftsman

Functional Responsibility: A Draftsman produces drawings, illustrations, slide presentations, layouts and other graphics to improve the quality of several communication techniques. A Draftsperson contributes to technical writing and environmental reporting.

Education /Experience: A Draftsman requires 2-10 years of experience in the respective area of expertise or a high school diploma and 2 or more years of college-level academic course work.

7. Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Specialist

Functional Responsibility: A GIS specialist supports environmental programs utilizing GIS software, mapping and cartography to assist in data analyses and presentations. A GIS specialist provides visual aids to clarify site management and remediation solutions.

Education /Experience: The GIS specialist requires 2-10 years of experience in their respective area of expertise and a MS and/or BS in GIS or related academic course work.

8. Technician Level 1

Functional Responsibility: A Technician Level is a field technician support professional level staff with their job responsibilities without much supervision. A Technician collects field data as directed, provides logistics and support for field activities and can enter information into varying systems or databases.

Education /Experience: A Technician Level requires 2 or more years of experience in the respective area of expertise or a high school diploma and 2 or more years of college-level academic course work.

9. Administrative Level

Functional Responsibility: An Administrator supports project management and development of technical documentation by clerical, word processing, filing and other office support and can function as a program administrator for all major contracts and assists the program manager with the administrative and financial requirements of the contract.

Education /Experience: An Administrator has a minimum of an AA, but a BA/BS preferred. This position is entry level to more than 5 years of experience and proficiency in basic computer applications.
